David: Failing to Set Boundaries

(Part 20) By Sergio Scataglini

Last month, we saw how David, who was chosen as king because his heart was for God, had now displeased Him. (2 Samuel 11:1-15) It reminds us that old righteousness is not enough. We need to keep our righteousness current.



There are boundaries we can set in our lives that will help us avoid the pitfalls David fell into. They can help us live a life that is pure and void of regrets.

First, it is wise to never “go to the roof” by yourself. When David went to the roof, he was alone, without accountability. Most of the time I travel with a family member or a team member.

It is another step in accountability and my team helps me to stay focused. In case any unfounded accusation be made, my team can act as a witness on my defense.

A second boundary we can set is being careful not to allow “public show-ers” around our palace. Get rid of all sensual literature, avoid exposure to pornographic images. Strive for both integrity and good ethics.

Thirdly, we must not forsake our people who are on the front lines. Remember the dedication, sacrifice, and offerings of those who support us. We should develop a sense of

loyalty to our own family members, friends and helpers in the ministry or at work. David ended up betraying a noble man and soldier, Uriah.

Fourthly, do not let legality rule morality. In I Corinthians 6, Paul says: *“Everything is permissible for me”—but not everything is beneficial. “Everything is permissible for me”—but I will not be mastered by anything. As King, David had power to take Uriah’s wife as his own but his action was evil.*

Fifthly, do not love the world or the things in the world. *“...don’t you know that friendship with the world is hatred toward God? Anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God.” (James 4:4).* This would include sensual gaz-

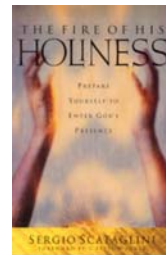

ing, shady jokes and greed.

In addition to these basic boundaries, it is good to set up specific boundaries regarding your eyes:

1) You don't have to stare at it just because it's there. Eye muscles are controlled by the brain and not vice versa;

2) You don't have to crave it just because it is attractive. Do you know your limits? Some people may say, "By faith, I disregard any limits." That is unlimited foolishness. We must begin with the reality of what tempts us.

3) You don't have to own it just because you can.

4) You don't have to accept it just because it's legal. Not all things that are legal edify. Abortion and frivo-

lous lawsuits are good examples of that.

David's major wickedness was to steal the only sheep that the poor man had--to be greedy for another man's woman. It was greed that conceived adultery and murder. Greed is the opposite of contentment. The greedy heart cannot say, "I have enough. Thank you Lord." (See James 3:16).

I encourage you, Friend, to set and stand by your boundaries. The outcome will be a greater freedom, greater joy and greater strength.

Pray with me, "Lord, I repent from my lack of boundaries. I renounce to the root problem of greed. I proclaim my covenant to You to be satisfied with what You give me. Amen." □
